## Message from Rev Nat

We have journeyed with Mary and Jesus through Advent and celebrated the birth of Jesus at Christmas. Did any of you have a present this Christmas that you particularly liked or was especially important to you? A special present does not have to be big or expensive, it may just be something you really wanted or like or a gift from a special person.

On 6<sup>th</sup> January we celebrate Epiphany, when the wise men travelled to see Jesus, how they came to worship him and bring him gifts.

There were other visitors who went to see Jesus - the shepherds. There are lots of differences between shepherds and wise men:

- the shepherds were poor and the wise men were rich.
- the shepherds came from the same country as Jesus (they were Jews) the wise men came from a different country (they were non-Jews or 'Gentiles'). Jews and Gentiles never mixed with each other
- The shepherds were in the fields close by and the wise men travelled a long way.
- Angels appeared to the shepherds and the wise men followed a star.

Epiphany means 'revelation' or showing and there are 3 things the story shows us:

1. Though they were so different God wanted the wise men and the shepherds to see Jesus. This shows us that God wants everyone to see Jesus. In God's eyes it doesn't matter if we are rich or poor or what country we come from.
2. At the time Jesus was born Jews and Gentiles never mixed. It would have been a hugely surprising revelation that God wanted Gentiles (the wise men) to see Jesus (a Jew). Epiphany reveals that God does not have favourites but welcomes people from any background and any nationality.
3. It seems that the wise men were rich enough to bring special gifts to Jesus. Even though it's not recorded in the Bible the shepherds may also have brought gifts for Jesus. The story shows us that one of the ways we respond to Jesus is to give.

A well-known Christmas carol has this verse in it -

What can I give him, poor as I am?  
If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb.  
If I were a wise man, I would do my part,  
Yet what can I give him – give my heart\*

What do these words mean to you?
